We have appointed a teacher to work in the grade 3 class starting next week. Stephanie Allwright will be visiting our school tomorrow and will start next week. Thank you to Michael Greenaway who has stepped in to the grade 3 class for the first few weeks, ensuring our students had a smooth and positive start to the year.



At Monday's assembly our House Captains were announced and were presented their badges by our Mayor, Colleen Furlanetto. We have a strong leadership program at our school, with all of our senior students expected to act as responsible leaders for the rest of the school. Our school captains and vice captains often represent our school at public events and chair our assemblies on Fridays. The SRC is made up of representatives from each class, from grade 3-6. The SRC is responsible for providing a student voice to the staff, they organise fundraisers and the grade 5 and 6 SRC are responsible for

#### JUNIOR SWIMMING SPORTS

#### Friday 12th February 2016

- The Junior Swimming Sports are for Grades F/1W, 1/2A & 1/2B
- Students attend school as normal until 12:30pm. (Lunch will need to be early and no lunch orders please.)
- Students will be organised in their Year Level F − 2.
- Teachers and students assemble at 12:30pm and bus to the pool in two groups.
- All students should be assembled in their House groups at the Euroa Swimming Pool by 12:50pm.
- Then move to Year Level and Program groups.
- The events will commence at approx 1:00pm and conclude at 2:00pm.
- Events are for all students in Grades F 2 only and are ability based using their RLSS Level 1 3.
- Students do not need to pay a Pool entry fee.
- Parents are encouraged to attend as helpers or spectators.
- Activities will be conducted in the beginners pool (Program A Level 1) and the shallow end of the main pool (Program B Level 2 & 3).
- 'House Captains' will be used to help conduct the events.
- Students must be reminded to observe pool rules.
- The Junior Swimming Sports are designed to promote maximum participation, with the emphasis on water safety and enjoyment.
- Only students who are being marshalled are permitted to be near the pool area, all other children/spectators must remain on the 'designated' areas.
- Children may wrap themselves in a towel while they wait for an event. (It is recommended that students bring 2 towels.)
- Teachers should ensure children are Sunsmart.
- Each Grade should organise some voluntary parental assistance.
- A participation certificate will be distributed to each swimmer.
- 1st, 2nd, 3rd ribbons may be awarded in some events.
- At the conclusion of the events students will have supervised free play in the pools until 2:30pm.

# **Kid's Turn Around**

Kids Turn Around (KTA) is a program for children aged between 7 - 11 who have or are experiencing family separation.

KTA operates for three days during school holidays. Next dates are April 5<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup>.

Family separation is a major change for children that can leave children worrying about their future, feeling uncertain and anxious. KTA provides an opportunity for children to explore and express feelings associated with parental separation or divorce and conflict, with other children going through similar experiences. Children develop coping strategies, stress management and problem solving skills- to assist them to make a more resourceful and confident transition.

Topics explored are:

Getting to Know You
Recognising Feelings
Exploring Feelings
Learning New Skills and Coping Plans
Promoting Positive Self Esteem - What's Special About Me
Moving Forward and Celebrating the Future
