Opening night for our school's art exhibition 'Artistic Observations of Fungi and the Amazing World beneath Our Feet' was a wonderful success. Our collaborative project with the SRCMN ongoing since the beginning of May has culminated in this amazing display of children's art and nature. Over 150 people attended on Friday night in the Schoolhouse. We were entertained by the Euroa Ukulele Band and Rodney Horsfall's cigar box guitar blues music and lovely food was provided by Euroa's Fare Enough and graciously served by our students.

Massive vases of native foliage, picked and presented by Cathy Olive from Euroa's Arboretum, graced the entrance. Colourful prints looked stunning along with photos of our students engaged in scientific observations, sketching and written accounts of their experiences with Alison Pouliot visiting fungi/ecologist expert and natural history

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photographer. In the main room, student's paintings and drawings from foundation level to grade 6 covered the walls transforming this space into an impressive art gallery.

A superb scientific display with detailed written information was carefully researched and arranged by Janet Hagen, SRCMN project

worker. Noelene Hull had created an incredible artistic arrangement of plants, foliage and fungi at the other end of the

main room. Lisa Firth had done some very careful foraging; obviously she has very good eyesight because she had collected some tiny little birds nest fungi most people have never seen before. She recreated some exquisite little worlds with bits of moss and tiny toadstools beautifully arranged on pieces of bark. These were fascinating for visitors to the



exhibition to observe through magnifying glasses and to recreate these tiny works by drawing and painting. Nature was in abundance!

On Saturday and Sunday students from our school demonstrated painting, drawing and printmaking along with three adult artists, Kelli McBay doing watercolour paintings, Catherine Mosely arranging mushrooms and leaves and foliage into pictures and Ian Firth doing coloured pencil sketches of still life arrangements of fungi. Over 100 people including students from others schools visited our science and art exhibition on these two days and many joined in the fun, painting and sketching the fungi on display.

Our school would like to sincerely thank the Strathbogie Ranges Conservation Management Network for their wonderful support for our school's inclusion in the Fungi festival, for the arranging of Alison Pouliot, fungi/ecologist expert to work with our students and for the provision of the refreshments on opening night. # JUNIOR CROSS COUNTRY (6th June 2016)

- All students in Grades F 2 should compete unless a parent provides an exemption.
- Students will be given a registered number to be written (in black marker) on the back of their hand.
- Students with asthma should pre-medicate and have a Ventolin inhaler with them.
- Students assemble on the oval at 2:15pm.
- Parents or student leaders will be placed at checkpoints around the course.
- The course follows the rear perimeter fence.
- Teachers/parents will time, mark students' hands and record results.
- Timetable of events:
  - > Grade 2 Girls / Boys (3 laps = 1500m) @ 2:20pm
  - ➤ Grade 1 Girls / Boys (2 laps = 1000m) @ 2:35pm
  - For Grade Prep Girls / Boys (1 lap = 500m) @ 2:50pm
- As each student completes a lap they have the back of their right hand marked, until they have finished.
- When each child finishes they report to the recording table to have their Reg. No. recorded.
- All students will be timed and results recorded.
- Students not participating will be supervised by teachers.
- All events should finish by 3:00pm.
- Placegetters will receive a ribbon and all competitors a certificate.
