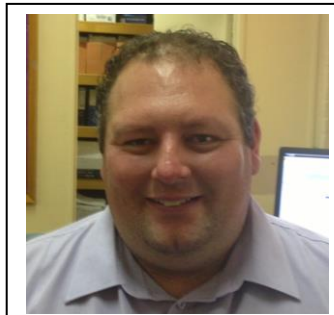
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JUNIOR CROSS COUNTRY

This week grades 5/6 students have been looking at the artwork of Peter Callesen, a paper sculptor who uses negative space. The cut-out part of the paper becomes part of the picture. He builds up objects from the cut-out parts. It's a very interesting approach where 3 dimensions and 2 dimensions work together. All grades will be focussing on paper sculpture until the end of term.



Some amazing imaginative paper sculptures have been created by all levels. Zeke Mundy's work has a shadow and a person standing up. Maison McCall created a fantasy with a chef cutting up a car and Zoe and Ashleigh are constructing a black 3 dimensional rabbit.

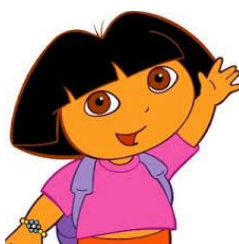
