
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REGIONAL CROSS COUNTRY

What are the Fundamental Motor Skills?

The **Fundamental Motor Skills** are the movement and ball skills which are seen as essential for all primary students to develop (throw, catch, kick, run, jump, bounce, leap, dodge, strike). These skills are taught during practice, play, and games, and often require repetition every year. It is expected that by Grade 6 students should have 'mastered' these skills in order to successfully participate in a range of sporting activities.

STUDENT REPORTS (2016 Semester 1)

The *Australian Curriculum* and the *Victorian Essential Learning Standards* (AusVELS) is the curriculum taught, assessed and reported in Victorian State Primary Schools.

At each Year level (F - 6) there are 'standards' which teachers use to assess students' learning.

At *Euroa Primary School* this semester we have introduced *Compass School Management System*, which incorporates a Student Report module. We have had a few technical problems and anomalies which we hope will be resolved before printing the reports.

Student Reports will have 'ratings' A – E (with C being the 'expected standard', which the majority of students achieve) and a 'graph' showing a student's 12 month progression. However, due to the diversity and breadth of the curriculum, not all learning areas (domains) of the AusVELS are taught each semester. Some AusVELS learning areas are taught by teachers thematically as 'Integrated Studies'. Teachers will also assess students' Work Habits (Effort, Behaviour) using the following scale.... Excellent, Very Good, Good, Satisfactory, Unsatisfactory. Student Reports will contain individual classroom teacher and specialist teacher comments.

Student Reports will be distributed to students at the end of Term 2. Parents will then have an opportunity to attend a **parent/teacher interview** early in Term 3 to discuss the report.
