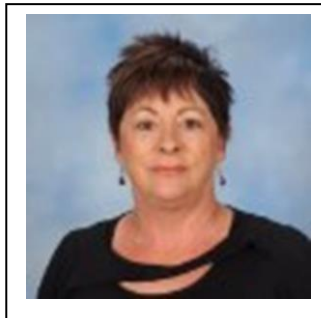

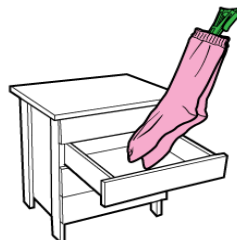

District Schools

- Euroa, St.Johns, Nagambie, St.Josephs, Murchison, Peranbin.

Information

- Ages are calculated as at **31st December 2016**.
- Students may enter a maximum of **four individual events** plus **one relay**.
- Each school may have **1 or 2 competitors** in each event.
- There is no parking or vehicle access inside the school grounds. Please park on the street.
- Children will assemble, in **Age Groups** (9/10yr, 11yr, 12/13yr Girls/Boys) on the NPS court at **9:30am – 9:40am**.
- Students' names and schools will be pre-recorded on the **Master Record Sheet**.
- **ESC students** will be responsible for an Age Group (Girls/Boys). Euroa S.C students are responsible for supervising groups, but teachers and adults will need to help if any misbehaviour occurs.
- An official at each event will **record individual results** on the Master Record Sheet.
- All students must remain with their age group during the events.
- Any child with a history of **asthma** should carry an inhaler.
- 800m event will commence at 9:50am. Students will then rotate individual events every **20 minutes**.
- Each event should have at least **two adult officials** to conduct the activity and record results.
- The events will be conducted as formally as possible, although some flexibility may be required to adhere to the **time limit**.
- No child will be permitted to compete in bare feet.
- Students must be reminded to remain with their groups, unless given permission otherwise.
- **Times** or **distances** will be **recorded** for each student competing and place-getters recorded for each event on the Result Sheets. (This data will then be used to select the 'Division' squad.)
- **Ribbons** will be distributed by teachers to the **place-getters** after each event.
- At the conclusion of **each session** an air-horn (whistle or bell) will be sounded to indicate change over.

- If time permits, **Lunch** is scheduled for 1:10pm.
- The Nagambie Primary School Parents' Club will be catering (optional) lunch and drinks.
- Each school will be responsible for organising their own **relay teams**.
- All **Master Record sheets** must be returned to the **Organiser (Ian Clinch)** at the conclusion of the day.
- Following the District Athletic Sports a team will be selected to compete at the **Ranges Division Athletic Sports** which will be held on **Tuesday 4th October** at Epping.
- Ian Clinch will select the team, complete the entries and an **email** will be sent to each school informing them of the selected competitors.
