
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## CROSS COUNTRY

## FACES

This week we have looked at some early 16<sup>th</sup> century portraits of important women wearing beautiful costumes and jewellery painted by Rembrandt and Durer. We discussed the Mona Lisa painted by Leonardo da Vinci and self-portraits by Vincent Van Gogh. Vincent Van Gogh is especially important right now as there is an exhibition of his work at the National Gallery of Art in Melbourne.

In our lessons this week, students were combining greyhead pencil and thick paint to create face portraits. They were provided with images of different hairstyles, mouths, noses and eyes. They could use these to create a composite face. Everyone enjoyed this, as the results were really unpredictable.
