
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WOOL WEEK PARADE

KINDER TRANSITION has been great fun these last 2 weeks. Please be aware 2018 foundation students will be enjoying the playground with us during recess on Friday. If you see a sad face or a lost child, don't forget to be good, kind and nice!

In Class:

The **INQUIRY** topic "Australian animals" has been explored in the junior classrooms these past few weeks. Come and see the beautiful animals F/1W have made in the junior gallery or ask your 1/2C student about the types of animals we have been learning about.

F/1W – Have been learning about length and time this week in Maths and have been working on their narrative stories, almost ready to be published.

1/2C – We have been working on our skip counting by 2, 5, 10 and 3s. In English, we have been working on our shape poems and using capital letters and full stops in our work.

2/3R – We have been exploring the first fleet. In Maths we have been learning about Mass, the weight of objects, and money, with a focus on adding amounts of money together while shopping. Narratives have been our writing focus this week, using a picture of a flying pig to inspire ideas.

READING AND CAFÉ: Don't forget to read nightly with your students, using their sight words to build up that bank of reading words. Also be on the lookout for interesting words in their books, an important CAFÉ strategy for improving reading and writing.

Mathematics

Over the next few weeks teachers will be busy collecting mathematical data about your child/children. This information is collected for students in years F-2 via an online test called the Mathematics Online Interview. The implementation of this assessment is an oral question and response format. Students are asked questions in regards to counting, place value, addition/subtraction, multiplication/division, measurement, length, mass, time, properties of shapes and visualisation of shapes.

Students in years 3- 6 have a Numeracy Fluency Assessment and an On Demand Mathematics Online Assessment. The Numeracy Fluency Assessment (NFA) involves questions around the concepts of counting, numeration, addition/subtraction, multiplication and division. The On demand mathematics test involves students reading their questions and selecting a multiple choice answer from the computer programme.

All of this data is collected by classroom teachers and used to generate your child's semester 2 end of year report.


