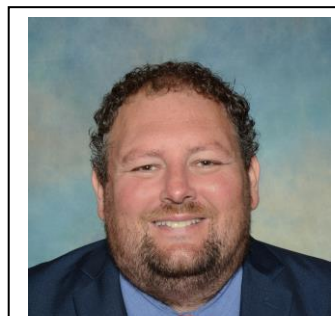
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WORLD OF MATHS

We then had the junior school bands from Euroa Secondary College play a range of music. It is great to have former Euroa Primary School students back in our school demonstrating the great talents they have learnt at Euroa Secondary College.



There is plenty of sport happening at the moment, with our senior students representing the school at the Winter Sports carnival last week. Football and T-Ball teams all played well and enjoyed the day. 14 students were in Yea today competing at Division level Cross Country. On Tuesday the F-2s had their Cross Country afternoon, with all of our junior students participating in 1, 2 or 3 laps of the school. I was proud of the persistence many students showed in completing the course. I was also impressed with our school and house captains who assisted with the organisation of the day.

Next week Deb and I will be attending the North East Victoria Regional Leadership Conference. As part of the conference, schools who have been achieving outstanding student results are asked to present a session on what the school is doing well. 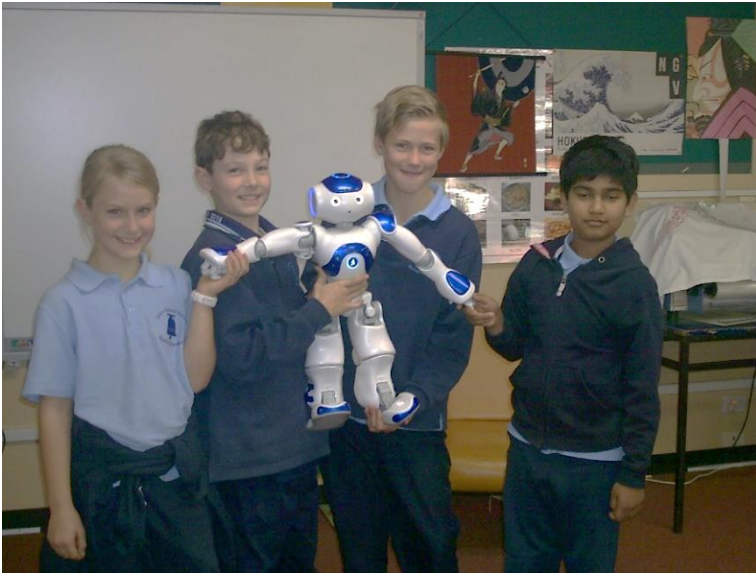
Junior Cross Country
