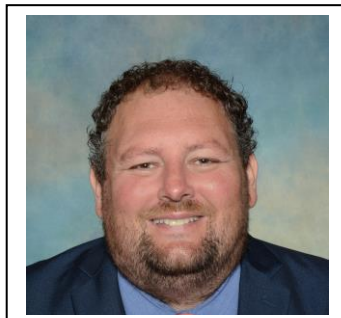

BREAKFAST CLUB - We have been very fortunate over the last few weeks to have received donations of fresh fruit which we have added to the choices students have for breakfast club.

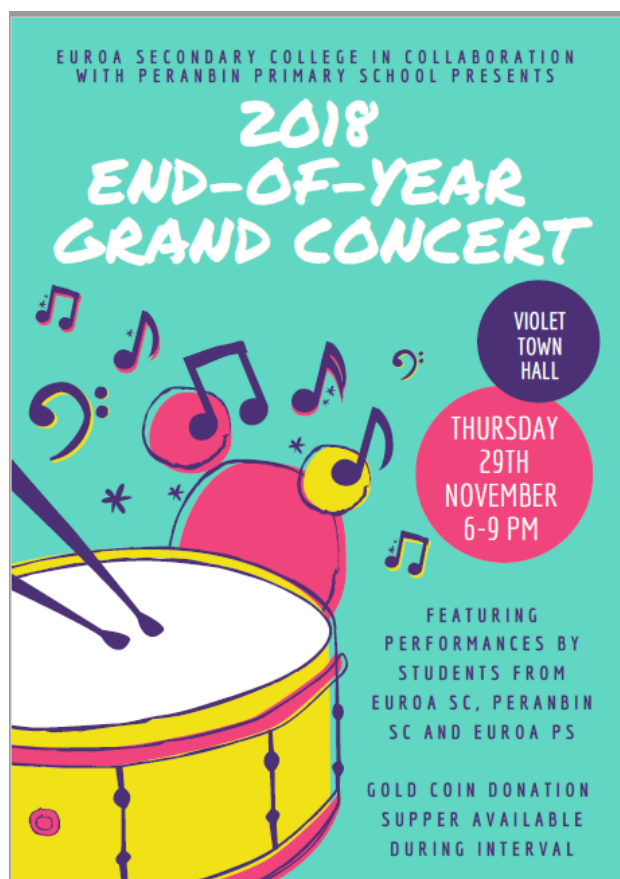
At present we are offering toast, cereals, fresh fruit (if available), snack fruits, juice, milo and small snack milks.
