Remote and Flexible Learning Thankyou's

A very big thank you to all students and staff for the work that has taken place during the first full week of remote learning.

Our school staff and leadership team understand the challenges remote learning provides and I would encourage families to maintain regular contact with staff and leadership to assist. 'We Can Do This' is a key mindset that we are encouraging all of our school community members to adopt during these changing and unusual times. By working together and caring and respecting each other we will not only get through these challenging times but also ensure that we continue to deliver positive results to our students.

Health and Wellbeing

As a school community we know and understand that the current situation can have an impact on one's health and wellbeing. We would like to take this opportunity to remind our school community that we have a wonderful and resourceful school Wellbeing Officer here at school, Jenny Jager, who can support students and families when needed.

For most of this year, families have been navigating the ups and downs of a new reality involving remote learning, working from home and lots of family time. Young people may find this second lockdown more challenging than the first with many mental health professionals concerned about an increase in youth anxiety and depression. Parents and carers are encouraged to take the lead by being pro-active in creating a scenario where everyone at home can be less anxious and better organised. As a family, it is important to focus on what worked, and what didn't work, last time

Parents and carers may see this as an opportunity to teach their kids the skills required to manage uncertainty in order to become more resilient. Communication will be key – finding out what they know, understanding what they need to feel safe and helping them focus on the things they can control.

Curriculum Day

A reminder that next Wednesday the 26th of August is a Curriculum day at Euroa Primary School. This means that there will be no onsite supervision of students, and no daily lessons or work to be completed for students at home either. We hope that all students enjoy this additional day of rest and relaxation next week!

Children Playing around the School Grounds

We have noticed an increase in children playing around the school yard during break times. These are children who are not part of our onsite learning program, and who also may not be students that are enrolled at our school. However, we are asking parents to ensure that their child/ren are not playing around the school site throughout the day, as we cannot supervise children who are not attending our onsite learning program.

Remote Learning Packs

We have changed the way we will be distributing our remote learning packs in Term 3.

Learning packs can now be picked up either on Friday or on Monday for the week ahead, starting from TOMORROW. This is in direct response to parent feedback, and we hope this makes things a little easier for those families who wish to collect the pack on a Friday.

The office will be open from 9am - 2pm on both the Monday and Friday for pack collection.

If you are unable to collect your pack, and would like to have your pack delivered, please contact the office to arrange delivery of your pack.

By creating the packs weekly, teachers are better able to respond to student learning needs. Collection of the packs weekly also allows for students and parents to remain connected to our wonderful school.

Office Hours

Due to staff working from home if and where possible, there will be a change to office hours for the remainder of Term 3. Our office will be staffed every day except for Tuesdays. On Tuesdays, there will be no staff in the office. If you need to get on contact with the school on these days, please call 5795 2212 and if someone does not answer, please leave a message.
