Term 4 Arrangements

Well as I am sure many of you are already aware, some announcements regarding Term 4 were made by Premier Daniel Andrews last Sunday. The key parts of this announcement and how they will apply at Euroa Primary School are as follows:

- All students will continue with remote learning for the first week of Term 4 (5th – 9th October)
- In week 2, students in grades 5/6 and in 3/4E will return to school and onsite learning on Monday the 12th of October
- In week 2, students in F/1A, 1/2K and 2/3D will continue with remote learning on the Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. These students will return to school and onsite learning on Thursday the 15th of October
- This is ONLY A PLAN at this stage and is subject to and may change in response to the ongoing health advice and updates

Early Dismissal – 2.30pm on Friday 18th September

A reminder that as school holidays begin next Friday afternoon. School officially finishes at 2.30pm Friday afternoon. Any students that are onsite for supervision on this day will need to be collected from the school at 2.30pm.

Onsite Attendance Forms

Just a reminder that the Onsite attendance form must be handed back to us either digitally or in hard copy by 3pm every Thursday. This will allow us to plan effectively for the following week and ensure all students have adequate supervision and teachers are able to continue with the Seesaw lessons.

Assessment Week

A reminder to all parents and carers that next week is assessment week. All students have now been allocated an hour time slot where they will come into the school and spend the hour with their teacher completing some end of term assessments. The data collected during these assessments will help to guide and inform teaching and learning in Term 4.

When students are dropped off for their assessment hour, students must enter the school via the office. Students can then be collected from the same place at the conclusion of their assessment hour.
